

District 2 and 12 Radio Zones

- The 800 MHz radio system has the capability to have 400+/- talkgroups organized into 26 zones.
- Thankfully, we only have to worry about the following zones:
 - Alpha
 - Bravo
 - Charlie
 - Mike
- The following pages provide a brief description of these zones and information about the talkgroups within each zone.
- The most important talkgroups are highlighted in yellow.
- Keep in mind, the procedures for using these talkgroups is still being developed, so the following info may change.

Alpha Zone

- Most of our communications will use talkgroups from this zone.
- Dispatch will, to the best of their ability, keep incident communications on the Alpha Zone.

1. Status	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • General purpose talk group appropriate for non-emergency or non- incident related traffic.
2. Dispatch	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Receive-only talkgroup for voice dispatch of units • announces incidents for all districts
3. S Prim	District 2 & 12 default incident talkgroup, will be used for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Single Fire Response (brush or structure) • Medical Calls (including MVAs) • Residential Fire Alarms • Hazmat Investigations (small/minor hazmat)
4. FD2 Adm OR FD12 Adm	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • District specific administrative talkgroup • Not monitored by dispatch • Not accessible to other districts
5. LERN 8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Statewide law enforcement mutual aid
6. HEAR	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • VHF Ambulance to Hospital
7. Wrly Fir	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Worley Fire, 700mHz
8. FNETTEKO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tekoa, VHF
9. SRMA 3-8 10.SRMA 4-8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Full response brush fire talkgroups
11.F OPS11 12.F OPS12 13.F OPS13 14.F OPS14 15.F OPS15 16.F OPS16	Will be used for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Full response structure fire • Extrication • Full response Hazmat

Bravo Zone

May be assigned as onscene tac channels if additional tac channels requested by command AND no channels available in Alpha Zone.

Mike Zone

- Regional ops and tac talk groups appropriate for training and special events.
- Mike Zone talk group assignment:
 - First come, first served
 - Select a talk group from the Mike Zone
 - Advise dispatch that you would like to use that talk group
 - Dispatch will either approve use of that talk group or advise you to select a different talk group
 - Dispatch will keep track of the assigned Mike Zone talk groups to prevent districts doubling up
 - Mike Zone talk groups are not monitored
